**WHEREAS:** this march recognizes that standing in defense of the marginalized is standing in the defense of all of us, and


**WHEREAS:** civil rights are a birthright of this nation, and every person of every race, gender, color, or creed deserves equal access to justice.


**“Women’s March Day”**
