WHEREAS: the Northwest Arkansas Center for Sexual Assault requests public support and assistance as it commits to work toward a community where our sisters, mothers, daughters and friends can safely live, work and learn.

"#MeToo March Day"


in Fayetteville, Arkansas and urge all citizens to take a stand against sexual harassment and abuse in order to create a safe community.
