Galveston, Texas in 1865, and

WHEREAS:

this is the oldest known celebration of the ending of

slavery in our country, honoring the enduring spirit

of our African-American community, and

WHEREAS:

on June 19, 1865, Union soldiers landed in Galveston,

Texas with news that the war had ended and the

slaves were free, and

WHEREAS:

the celebration of June 19 became "Juneteenth" with

a festive gathering of family in prayer and

celebration, and

WHEREAS

the Northwest Arkansas Juneteenth Celebration, an

extravaganza of culture and diversity sponsored by

the University of Arkansas African-American Resource Group and the Juneteenth Planning Committee, is a community-wide commemoration

for all of our citizens and their families.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Lioneld Jordan, Mayor of the City of Fayetteville, Arkansas do hereby proclaim Saturday, June 16, 2018 as

"Juneteenth Celebration Day"

in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
