Proclamation




- WHEREAS:** in 2020, an estimated 57,600 people will be diagnosed with pancreatic cancer in the United States, and 47,050 will die from the disease, and
- WHEREAS:** pancreatic cancer is one of the deadliest cancers, is currently the third leading cause of cancer death in the United States, and it is projected to become the second leading cause around 2030, and
- WHEREAS:** pancreatic cancer is the only major cancer with a five-year relative survival rate in the single digits, at just 10%, and
- WHEREAS:** when symptoms of pancreatic cancer present themselves, it is generally in later stages, and 71% of pancreatic cancer patients die within the first year of their diagnosis, and
- WHEREAS:** approximately 440 deaths will occur in Arkansas in 2020, and
- WHEREAS:** there will be an estimated 484,000 new pancreatic cancer cases diagnosed worldwide in 2020, and
- WHEREAS:** the good health and well-being of the residents of Fayetteville are enhanced as a direct result of increased awareness about the symptoms and risk factors of pancreatic cancer, and research into early detection, causes, and effective treatments.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Lioneld Jordan, Mayor of the City of Fayetteville, Arkansas do hereby proclaim November 19, 2020 as

“WORLD PANCREATIC CANCER DAY”

in Fayetteville, Arkansas.
