Q: What if it rains?

Gulley Park Summer Concert Series is **NOT** a RAIN OR SHINE event! If inclement weather is forecasted, every attempt will be made to decide by 2:00 p.m. This will be announced on our social media and webpage (www.fayetteville-ar.gov/concerts), in addition we will notify our vendors via email.

Q: What should I bring?

Bring your lawn chair and blankets for open lawn sitting. We encourage you to bring the whole family including your furry friends, but please remember that dogs must remain on a leash. To help prevent the spread of COVID-19, masks are encouraged at outdoor events in City parks, especially when social distancing is difficult to maintain and when many attendees are present. We strongly suggest those who are not vaccinated to wear a mask at all times when social distancing is not possible.

Q: Where is event parking?

Limited paved parking is available off both park entrances on Old Wire Road and Township Avenue. Parking attendants will guide vehicles into the extended open field parking areas as needed. Early arrival and carpooling are strongly encouraged.

Q: Will bike valet be an option?

Yes! Bike valet will be a free option for those who choose to ride to the event.

Q: Will there be food offered on-site?

The following food trucks will be available on-site for your chance to taste the local flavor and support our hometown food artists: ChowHounds Street Grub, BeaverTails, CrackerJack and Burton's Creamery. Food trucks will serve food from 6:15pm-8:45pm.

Q: Can we bring in outside food and drink?

You're more than welcomed to bring in outside food and drink. Please refrain from bringing in glass or alcoholic beverages. We encourage spectators to use our trash and recycling bins located on site.

Q: I lost something at Gulley Park Concert! How can I get it back?

Q: Can I bring my dog to the concerts?
