 - **1** veteran owned ventures through these 1:1 engagements

- **20** Event, Workshop, and Program engagements for Fayetteville entrepreneurs serving nearly **720** attendees

Monthly Progress Highlights:

- In partnership with the City, continued to support the Fayetteville Small Business Resiliency Task Force (FSBRTF).
- Began working with the FSBRTF on the early planning stages for the City of Fayetteville Economic Recovery and Vitality Plan
- Continued ALL events virtual and kept our event cadence very high.
- Continued support of the City's Outdoor Refreshment Area (ORA) initiative. Critical to helping drive business to our local small businesses while helping mitigate the pandemic.
- Continued regular announcements relaying the latest federal and state aid updates for small businesses, and in doing so responded to hundreds of inquires from small businesses working with them on the mechanics and details of each.
- Continued to spend significant time and effort in 1:1 virtual no-cost consulting sessions with small business owners dealing with the existential issues due to the pandemic.
- Continued work on the Spectrum Living Solutions project to advance the progress on this critical project.
- Continued advocating to Congressional, Federal, and State authorities for key programs and incentives to support the small business and startup community during COVID-19 recovery.
- Led and supported virtual events ranging from "Cómo Ganar Más Clientes" to "Effective Social Media Strategies for Women in Business" – providing maximum relevant education and inspiration opportunities to Fayetteville entrepreneurs.
